ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

STORES AND EQUIPMENT

During the last two months, the following items of equipment were received at the museum. Details as under----

Sufficient sleepers for the laying of the three additional lengths of track in front of roads 2, 3 and 4 (work will commence on November 3 next)

Electrical equipment which will enable the complete restoration to working order of the Prison Car (No. 948). This included two GE67 motors from ballast motor No. 47u, plus controllers and compressor, etc., off the same car.

Consequent upon the closure of Newtown Depot on Saturday, September 28, a considerable amount of equipment was received. This included a work bench and vice, an armature lifting jack, cleaning trollies and all records appertaining to the last week of operation.

Sufficient corrugated iron has been obtained and will enable the roof to be completely covered. In conjunction with this job will be the replacement of the existing temporary walls with the new permanent corrugated iron walls.

WATER SERVICE

During the last weekend, October 20, a team of eight members laid the water service to the Depot building, a distance of 141 feet. One inch pipe was used to ensure a good pressure of water.

WATER CAR 113S

An application was made to the Department on May 12, 1953, for 113W to be preserved for historical preservation and we were informed at that stage that it was still required for Departmental use. Following on the closure of Wolli Creek Per-way yards to all tramway traffic, this car was sent to Randwick Workshops for scrapping. The Museum Executive has made an application to the Department for this unique car and if handed over, it will, we believe, be the second water car ever to enter a museum (the other car is in Britain and formerly operated by Cardiff Tramways).

NEXT GENERAL MEETING

The next general meeting will be held on Saturday, November 2, at 2.00pm sharp on the site.

WORKS PROGRAMME

Following on from the first meeting of the Supervisors held on September 13 the General Manager outlined the suggested works programme to the Executive for 1957/58. His recommendations were as under ---

- 1) Construction of 90' of roadbed and track
- 2) Construction of No. 1 road in the depot
- 3) Clearing of the area in preparation of the laying of depot fan
- 4) Construction of a water main from the Board's main to the depot
- 5) Erection of roof and dismantling of existing walls and erection of new iron walls
- 6) Connection to Sydney County Council electricity mains.

The cost of the above works was estimated to be $\pounds 290$.

TOURS

The proposed train tour is still being negotiated with the Railways Department and in the interim members have suggested another trolleybus tour. These details are to be discussed at the next general meeting.

MEMBERS OVERSEAS

Two New South Wales members are currently on working holidays overseas primarily to see electric rail lines which we hear much about. Peter Lambert has reached Canada so far and has secured a job with the Canadian Pacific as a Per-way Engineer. Noel Reed, who set out in the opposite direction is in England. The last we heard from Noel is that he is to give a lecture to the LRTL on electric street lines in Australia.

TROLLEY WIRE REVIEW

SOUTH AUSTRALIAN DIVISION

Museum Site

At the general meeting of the South Australian Branch held on August 23 last, members were informed by the Chairman that the Branch's application for the site in the Adelaide National Park was rejected by Park Commissioners on the grounds that it would set a precedence. In consequence of this decision the West Beach Recreation Reserve Trust was approached and a report and other literature on the Museum was handed over in support of an application for a site at that location. A decision is expected in the near future.

Rolling Stock Alterations and Additions

John Radcliffe, Branch President, has been in contact with the Rolling Stock Department of the MTT concerning the cars already marked for inclusion in the Museum, and arrangements are being made to have F1 class No. 282 substituted in place of F1 No. 264.

Adelaide trolleybus No. 216 (the famous "Green Goddess") has been purchased by the Branch and restoration work has already commenced.
