WORK DAYS

### SUB - STATION

This problem child of ours is at last under control. The National Park trust have given approval for the construction of the Sub-station adjacent to our Depot. The Department of Govt.' Transport have sold us the complete Gray St. substation for £700. This unit consists of two rotary convertors, switch panels etc. and two oil transformers all around 24 years old. HOWEVER the Board of Directors have decided that unless the State Government can see its way clear to make a substantial grant to us to cover the total cost of this project (about £1,200) or part thereof, we will reject the D.G.T's offer and postpone electrification of our line for anything up to two years. The operation of our cars by other means has not been overlooked. Don't dispare but because we are very hopeful that the grant will be made to us. We should know within a week.

#### WORK AT NATIONAL PARK

The number of Shareholders appearing for work at National Park each week has increased considerably. It is now possible to do many of the larger jobs without having to plead with members to turn up. Keep up the work.

The "F" car is now completely overhauled and repainted together with re-wiring are all that remain to be done. "C" car 290 is also undergoing a complete A/O. The "N" car No. 728 is the latest car to be started on and this car will also receive an A/O. The "N" and "F" cars are to be the first two on the road.

The Depot building itself is now well on the way to completion. 44 gallons of special roofing compound have been obtained to seal up the leaks in the roof thus ensuring a dry "workshop". The timber and iron to complete the re-walling of the depot have been purchased. Work on this very important section will commence now in order to get it done before the school holidays. We don't want any more visits from the little angles.

All who can are asked to attend during the period 17<sup>th</sup> Dec to 8<sup>th</sup> Jan. to get all this work done. Enough sleepers have been obtained to allow us to complete the Depot fan area as well as about 100 yards of main line. This will be gone on with from January onwards.

Tree planting and scrub clearing around the depot has now been completed. The area now looks quite attractive.

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
