APRIL 1961 S. P. E. R. NEXT MEETING

On Friday, April 7th next, the next meeting of the Society will be held in Room 3 of the Railway Institute Devonshire St. City. During the meeting movie films will be screened of the Rockdale Enfield and Newcastle tramways. The meeting will commence at 7.30 pm and all members are requested to be on time.

RAILWAY REGULATIONS.

Regulations covering the working of the Railways are being distributed and will take effect as from April 15th next. All shareholders are expected to make themselves familiar with these new regulations. Any member who does not received a copy by the above date will he please contact the Secretary. Upon reading regulation No. 15 you will notice mention is made of Country, Non-Working and Working Members. It has become necessary to divide the membership of the Society into three distinct divisions and a card will be issued to every shareholder as a means of division identification and it will be necessary for each and every shareholder to produce his card to gain entry to the site at National Park. AT THE SITE.

The roof is completed: Every car is now under cover and a systematic programme of repainting can now be instituted.

Work on the Depot track fan has now reached a point where all that remains is the connection of the point rodding, final ballasting up to rail head, a small amount of cutting and of course track bonding. The laying of this section of track was a difficult job for our tack gang involving four points and a single slip which, when first viewed on site, was nothing more than a pile of rail pieces.

Fencing has commenced along the road side of the site and is well under way. This fencing will consist of a 2 strand wire and post and is primarily intended to control motor traffic on the visitors day each month.

SPER TOUR.

The Board has applied for a tour of the gravel and coal railways of the Illawarra.

The trip will be made in a CPH on SUNDAY MAY 4th next. The trip will depart from Sydney terminal at approx. 8 am and we hope to operate over the Metropolitan Colliery, Port Kembla Harbour, sidings and Loco, the A.I.S. line to Unanderra, Wongawilli Colliery, Shellharbour Quarry, Bombo Quarry lines then to Kiama. With an inspection of the former 2ft gauge system of that town returning to Sydney at approx. 6 pm.

At the time of writing the cost has not been set by the Railway Dept but should be around 30/-.
